

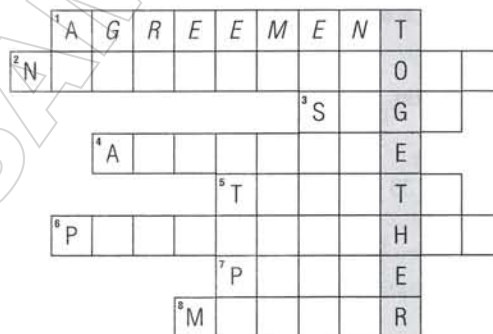

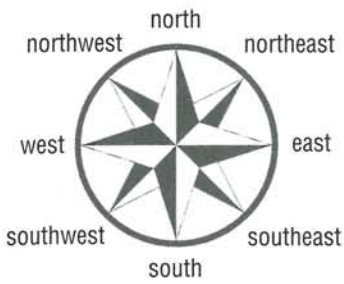
- agreement (n) /ə'grɪmənt/ An arrangement or decision about what to do.

 attack (vb) /ə'tæk/ To start a fight.
 common interests (n) /kəmən 'ɪntərəsts/ To have the same objectives.
 defence (n) /dɪfens/ Actions taken to protect someone or something from attack.
 defend (vb) /dɪfend/ To protect someone or something from attack.
 member of an organisation (n) /membə(r)/ To be or become part of a group.
 negotiate (vb) /nɪ'gəʊʃieɪt/ To talk or discuss and reach an agreement.
 negotiations (n) /nɪ'gəʊʃi'eɪnz/ Talks or discussions to reach an agreement.
 partnership (n) /'pɑːtnəʃɪp/ An alliance or agreement to work together.
 peace (n) /piːs/ The opposite of war.
 peace-keeping forces (n) /piːski:pɪŋ fɔːsɪz/ Troops that are placed between two opposing forces to stop them fighting and maintain the peace.
 peace-keeping operations (n) /piːski:pɪŋ ɒpə'reɪʃnz/ Missions or tasks designed to maintain peace.
 peace talks (n) /piːs tɔːks/ Discussions to reach an agreement to stop fighting.
 self-defence (n) /selfdɪfens/ Protection of your own interests.
 sign (vb) /saɪn/ To write your name.
 treaty (n) /tri:ti/ An official or written agreement between two or more countries.
