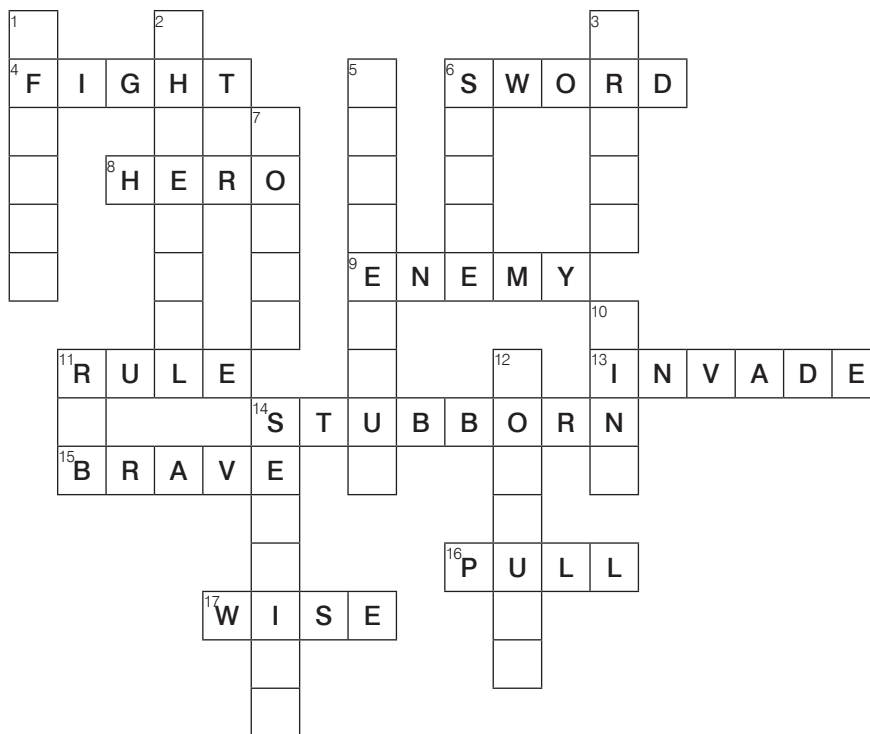

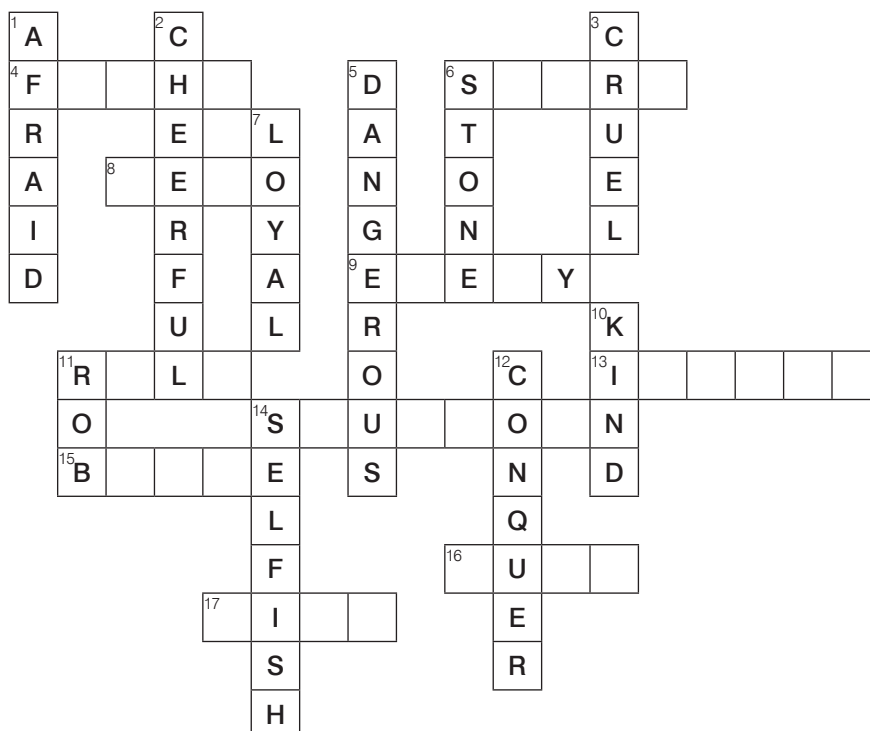




## **Part 2** (Extension) TRUTH AND LIES
