# Roald Dahl



Roald Dahl started writing a secret diary when he was eight. He wrote in the diary every day and he hid it in an enormous conker tree in the garden.

Roald Dahl started boarding school when he was nine. He didn't like it. He was excellent at sports, but he wasn't very good at writing stories!

When he was 13, he started a new school. The school was near a chocolate factory. Roald loved chocolate, but he didn't like chocolate cake or chocolate ice cream. He wrote his first children's book in 1943. It was called The Gremlins. Then, he started writing more books for adults. He didn't write another story for children until 1961, when he wrote

James and the Giant Peach. He wrote Charlie and the Chocolate Factory after that. Roald Dahl wrote over 20 books for children. He always wrote his stories in pencil on yellow paper. Roald Dahl's stories were very popular, but he only won a few prizes, including one for *The Witches* in 1983 and another for *Matilda* in 1988. His books are still very popular today. There are films of some of his books, too.

He once said, 'If you're going to get anywhere in life, you have to read a lot of books.'
