



George Orwell's

Nineteen Eighty-Four

George Orwell was a gifted 20th-century British writer who was interested in politics and social justice. He was born in 1903 in India when it was under British rule. Soon after he was born his mother brought him to England. He was educated at Eton,



one of the oldest and best English schools. His parents could not afford to send him to university. Instead, he joined the Indian Imperial police service. He hated his colonial job and **disapproved of** the British Empire. In 1928 he **resigned** and spent several years in London and Paris doing **odd jobs**. He also travelled round England, living as a **tramp** and writing about the terrible poverty and social injustice he saw.

He was passionately opposed to fascism and in 1936 he joined one of the International Brigades to fight against Franco in the Spanish Civil War. He was shot in the neck in 1937 but managed to escape across the French border. He later wrote a book called *Homage to Catalonia* about his experiences. Orwell died of tuberculosis in 1950 aged only 46. During his lifetime he was well known as a journalist but today he is famous as a great 20th-century novelist.

Nineteen Eighty-Four is one of Orwell's most famous novels. It was first published in 1948. The story is set in London in the future – the 1984 of the title – and describes a **dystopian** world always at war. A **totalitarian** government is in power and the state controls every part of people's lives by using television broadcasts and hidden cameras. Orwell was a very inventive writer and in *Nineteen Eighty-Four* he introduced new words and ideas into the English language: 'newspeak', 'doublethink', 'memory hole', 'thought police', and the phrase 'Big Brother is watching you'. *Nineteen Eighty-Four* is even more **relevant** to society today than it was when Orwell wrote it.


