





Cosmic maths

Read the text and do the puzzle.

All the planets go around the Sun, but some planets take longer than others. This means that a year on Earth is shorter or longer than on different planets. For example, in one year on Earth, Mercury goes round the Sun 4 times. In one year on Earth, a person on Earth has one birthday. But a person on Mercury would have four birthdays! Yes, if you're 10 years old on Earth, you're 40 years old on Mercury! Mars takes 2 years to go round the Sun. And Jupiter takes 12 years to go round the Sun.
