Race to the South Pole

Amundsen and his team arrived at the South Pole on 14th December 1911. Two months later, Roald Amundsen and a team of eight explorers left Norway. Scott and his men were ill and freezing cold and on their return they tragically died. They also wore warmer clothes and took lighter equipment than Scott's team. Scott and four of his men finally reached the South Pole three weeks later. The weather in the Antarctic was terrible, and it was very difficult for both teams. In June 1910, Captain Robert Scott and a team of 53 explorers left Britain to reach the South Pole.

But Amundsen's expedition used fewer men and they travelled faster.
