


## **Context**





## **Online**

- Informal assessment is more difficult online.
- Building a relationship with students is more difficult.
- Reactions, body language, sitting posture, gestures.
- Less spontaneous.
- Needs to be more formalised.
- Needs to be more planned.





### **Informative**

Formative assessment, formative evaluation, formative feedback, or assessment for learning, including diagnostic testing, is a range of formal and informal assessment procedures conducted by teachers during the learning process in order to modify teaching and learning activities to improve student attainment.

## **Summative**

Summative assessment, summative evaluation, or assessment of learning refers to the assessment of participants where the focus is on the outcome of a program. This contrasts with formative assessment, which summarizes the participants' development at a particular time. (from Wikipedia)


## **Summative-E Portfolios**

Students add up content as they produce it in class/homework. This can be in groups, alone, in pairs etc.

They embed it into their E-Portfolio.


They reflect on what they have done.
