### Task summary:

- Write an **e-postcard**. Write to a friend **from an interesting town or city**.
- This writing lesson is about **how to use correct punctuation**. Look at the **HOW TO** box on **page 18** to learn how to use punctuation in your e-postcard.
- Use **grammar** from **Unit 1** in your e-postcard. Use **there is / there are** and **prepositions of place** from **page 13** and **have got** from **page 15**.
- Try to use some new **words** from **page 130** in your e-postcard.
- Write about **60 words**.

### EXAM TIP

Learn to think about timing. In exams, time is important. Use a watch or a clock when you write.

### Before writing:

Always make a plan! Use the *Writing plan* on **page 18** to do the writing task. Tick (✓) the boxes when you do the things it tells you to do.

Write a greeting and start your e-postcard. Say where you're writing from.

Write about the town or city. What special places has the city got? What can you see? What can you do?

Use *have got* to talk about the things you can see in the city.

Ask your friend to visit you.  
Say good bye and write your name at the end.

Use prepositions (*in front of*) to describe where things are.
