





Most accidents happen in places where you spend a lot of time, like your home or your school. Watch out for things that are dangerous. Look out for signs and stickers to help you see these.

Call for help or phone for an ambulance quickly.



You should stay calm and talk to the person.



Don't move the person.



You should put a **pillow** under their head to make them comfortable.

Put cold water on the burn for ten minutes.

If necessary, see a doctor.



4 SUN STROKE



Move the operson out of the sun straight away.



You should give the person some water to drink.





5 AN INSECT STING



Wash the area where the sting is with soap and water.



You should put ice or a cold cloth on the sting.




Don't **scratch** the sting.

HOW TO STOP ACCIDENTS AT SCHOOL
