He was soon promoted and in 1795 became Commander-in-Chief of the Army of the Interior. This promotion made him rich and famous.

In 1796 Napoleon led the Italian Army in a series of battles against Austria. By the time Italy defeated Austria in October 1797, it was clear that Napoleon was one of the world's greatest military leaders. **4.3.** ____ He was crowned in a very fancy ceremony at the Notre Dame in Paris.
