A. WOMBATS

Wombats are one of the strangest animals ever! Native to Australia, these funny-looking creatures resemble short, fat bears. But wombats are really marsupials, just like koalas and kangaroos. The colour of their fur helps them blend in with the landscape and avoid dangerous animals. A wombat is most active in the early evening and at night. There are three species of wombat: common, or bare-nosed, wombats, which have a bare nose, and two species of hairy-nosed wombats that have, well, hairy noses! The two species differ in the size of ears as well. If you choose a wombat as a pet, don't let it mislead you – it may seem cute and cuddly, but it can become very aggressive if it feels threatened.

B. CAPUCHIN MONKEYS

Lively and tiny, capuchin monkeys make good, though unusual pets. The fur of the capuchin monkey may differ, but most commonly it has got cream or light tan colouring around the face, neck and shoulders. The rest of its coat is dark brown. The hair is shorter and darker on its back than on other parts of the body. The monkeys are very light – they weigh only 1.35–5.9 kilograms, which might be due to the light diet they feed on. A typical menu for capuchin monkeys includes fruit, insects, leaves and small birds. They are particularly good at cracking nuts, which are not only their meal but also a great toy.

C. OPOSSUM

There are more than sixty different species of opossum. They do not kill other animals, and they often visit human homes to search garbage cans. However, they will be more than happy to grab a snack of mice, birds, insects, worms, snakes, and even chickens, which means it might be quite a challenge for the owner to impress his pet with all the delicacies they like. Also, as marsupials, opossums grow in their mother's pouch (a bag-like hole on the stomach). An opossum at birth is as small as a honeybee. Babies immediately crawl into the mother's pouch, where they continue to develop. As they get larger, they will go in and out of the pouch and sometimes ride on the mother's back as she hunts for food.
