Roskilde Festival has been one of the most acclaimed culture and music festivals in northern Europe since its very beginnings. It is run by a non-profit organisation, whose purpose is to reinforce and popularise youth culture initiatives. Apart from its regular full-time employees, the festival is manned by an impressive number of more than 30,000 volunteers. Their duties range from putting up the stalls and stages through providing camping security to organising fun activities. Most volunteers are from cultural organisations and sports associations in the area. It is most probably the bonds that are created between these people that contribute to the unique ambience at the festival.

While most people know Glastonbury as the event whose artists attract thousands of fans from all over the globe and which sells out all the tickets in a split second, few festival-goers realise that Glastonbury is very much socially engaged. Last year, for example, you could spot a giant polar bear at the Meeting Point and even take a shot for free! The activity was not only a mere crowd-pleaser but also had a function to perform, related to Greenpeace stands located at the entrance to the Greenfields. In 2013 Greenpeace launched a global campaign to save the Arctic from exploitation and came to Glastonbury to gain followers and have extra publicity. To make the endeavour look like an integral part of the festival, all staff members were wearing Greenpeace logos and took an active part in promoting the good cause.

plentiful. **5.1.** ___ Indeed, what gives graphic novels such a competitive edge in comparison to other books is the fact that graphic novels are flexible and can be equally appealing to the recipients with reading skills of different levels. **5.2.** ___

One very important prerequisite for graphic readers to become effective is for parents and educators to overcome their prejudice. **5.3.** ___ What are they exactly? To start with, they have a great potential for improving reading skills of students struggling with language acquisition, including special-needs students, due to the illustrations which provide contextual clues to the meaning of the written narrative. Graphic novels can also give autistic students clues to emotional context that they might miss when reading traditional text. **5.4.** ___ For that matter, it can be claimed with a great degree of certainty that reading graphic novels can help students develop the critical skills necessary to read more challenging works in the future.

Text 1.

It was in the spring of the year 1894 that all London was interested, and the fashionable world dismayed, by the murder of the Honourable Ronald Adair in the most inexplicable circumstances. The public had already learned the particulars of the crime which came out in the police investigation; but a good deal was suppressed, since the case for the prosecution was so overwhelmingly strong that it was not necessary to bring forward all the facts. Only now, at the end of nearly ten years, am I allowed to supply those missing

links which make up the whole of that remarkable chain. The crime was of interest in itself, but that interest was as nothing to me compared to the inconceivable sequel, which afforded me the greatest shock and surprise in my adventurous life. Even now, after this long interval, I find myself feeling once more that sudden flood of joy, amazement, and incredulity. Let me say to that public which has shown some interest in those glimpses which I have occasionally given them of the thoughts and actions of a very remarkable man that they are not to blame me for not sharing my knowledge with them. I would have felt obliged to have done so if he hadn't prohibited me on various occasions. This prohibition was only withdrawn on the third of last month.

My close intimacy with Sherlock Holmes had aroused my interest in crime, and after his disappearance I never failed to read with care the various problems which came before the public. I even attempted more than once for my own private satisfaction to employ his methods in their solution, though with little success. There was none, however, which appealed to me like this tragedy of Ronald Adair. As I read the evidence, which led up to a verdict of premeditated murder, I realised the loss which the community had suffered by the death of Sherlock Holmes. There were points about this strange business which would have specially appealed to him, and the efforts of the police would have been incorporated, or even anticipated, by the trained observation and the alert mind of the first criminal agent in Europe. I contemplated the case in my mind, and found no explanation which seemed to be adequate. At the risk of telling a twice-told tale I will recapitulate the facts as they were known to the public at the end of the investigation.

Text 2.

Forensic science and crime scene investigation have come a long way since they had been first recognised as a separate branch of science. After the initial struggle for funding and the quest to prove that investing in the development of police science is by all means profitable, the research in the field took off and brought spectacular results. However, not awe-inspiring advances in CSI but an account of a few basic techniques now often taken for granted, but which were completely out of reach for detectives fifty years ago, are worth mentioning. Why? Because contrary to a popular belief that the best crime scene investigation techniques are the most astounding ones, the tools which have greatly impacted collecting evidence are downright boring.

Perhaps the most under-appreciated of such developments are protective gloves – an easily affordable, mass-produced object, which has truly changed the quality of detectives' work. Personal safety is of utmost importance on every crime scene and it is nothing else but wearing protective gloves that helps us make sure we abide by the safety regulations. The gloves are our first line of defense against biohazards, such as HIV and the much more infectious hepatitis viruses, that are often found at the crime scene.

Another great aid in crime scene investigation, easily belittled, is the video camera, which has revolutionised the way evidence is documented and analysed. Nowadays, automated colour film processing has opened up new possibilities for CSI teams, as the visual documentation of the crime scene preserves details that can be presented to attorneys or juries and criminals can be prosecuted many years after the crime was actually committed.
