Tekst 1.

It was May 2019 and I had to do a video project which required taking my 8-year-old son Albert to the beach for the video. Albert and I went to a spot that was usually pretty popular. There's a road that runs along the beach, and it's separated from the beach by a very large sand barrier that gets even larger when covered by snow and ice. A few places have breaks in the sand barrier, and this spot was at one of those breaks. When the weather is nice and the ocean is liquid, lots of people can be found in that particular place. Even though the weather was getting nice, the ocean was still covered by ice along the beach, and the beach was still covered by a lot of ice and compacted snow, as well.

Like any good rural Alaskans, we scanned the beach before venturing from the road and noticed nothing unusual. There were a few boats on the beach, which would seem out of place at other beaches, but not this one. When I didn't see any bears, I asked Albert to go closer to the water and act like he was having lots of fun. He ran about 20 yards out and started running around, jumping in the air, and shouting a lot, while I filmed him. All of a sudden, out of the corner of my eye, maybe 30 yards past Albert's crazy antics, a polar bear popped its head up. It must have been surprised by all the sudden noise.

The human brain is incredibly fast. Even though it only took me a second or two to respond, I went through a long process of thoughts in those moments. First, of course, was sheer terror for my sweet boy. Then, I realised that the polar bear must have known we were there for a long time. Since the moment we stepped out of the car, in fact, it had smelled us. I was awed for a nanosecond by how well it was hidden behind a large chunk of ice in a low spot. But anyway, if it had wanted to eat us, we would have already been dead. Finally, I made a decision about how to react. I put my phone down and called Albert to stop and slowly walk toward me without looking behind him. The polar bear was still watching us. Of course, Albert heard the panic in my voice. He looked over his shoulder and saw the bear. He started running to me, and terrifyingly, the bear started to move just slightly toward us. I'm pretty sure my heart stopped when he started moving, but looking back, I think it looked more like he was curious about us.

As soon as the bear moved, I started running to get between him and Albert. I yelled, 'Get to the car! Go!' Any mom would do the same thing. It's just instinct. If somebody had to be eaten, it was going to be me. I hadn't gotten more than a few steps past Albert when I realized the bear wasn't moving. He was just watching us with mild interest. So we stopped running and we backed all the way to the break in the sand barrier.

We went home and told my oldest child, Alicia, about the experience. She demanded that we take her there, just to see if the bear was still there. She hadn't seen one in the wild yet. So, we drove back to the same place. We climbed up the sand barrier and took some pictures from there, but when the bear started ambling up the beach much closer to us, we went back to the car and took pictures from the safety of the sunroof and the door windows. So that was our polar bear experience. The humans lived happily ever after, and I hope the bear is living his best life, too.

The Riders of Icebergs

The polar bear is the majestic symbol of the Arctic Circle. It is one of the largest land predators in the world, known to be a fierce fighter and a keen swimmer, but also a playful creature. Polar bears are descendants of brown bears and their genetic similarity allows them to successfully mate together and produce fertile offspring.

Nowadays, several unfavourable factors are causing the population of these beautiful mammals to decline. Traditionally, polar bears have had only one enemy – man. In Russia, for example, where all hunting has been banned, and only a limited number of polar bear cubs can be trapped for zoos, poaching still continues and poses a major threat to the population of polar bears inhabiting the Russian Arctic.

However, most scientists agree that the most serious problem is global warming which has already caused the Arctic ice pack to decrease. This has made polar bears hunt seals from drifting packs of ice, which may be fatal as they are often unable to reach land despite their excellent swimming skills. Not surprisingly, the shrinkage of the ice mass also has a similar effect on their prey.

The Arctic summer is the period when polar bears withdraw to the land as the ice pack is too thin to allow hunting. It is the time when females give birth to their cubs and have to survive on reserves of fat within their bodies until they can resume hunting when the summer is over. However, due to the consequences of global warming, they have to do without food for longer and longer periods, which results in weak offspring and further causes their population to decline.

The reproductive abilities of polar bears are also strongly affected by the toxins which are found in the seals that the bears eat. Polar bears have been found to be some of the most contaminated organisms in the Arctic area. Their tendency to accumulate toxic chemicals so easily results from their high-fat diet. The grimmest predictions say that most of the population of polar bears will be wiped out by the end of the century unless effective action is taken immediately.

What makes polar bears an endangered species?

There are a number of reasons why the population of polar bears is in decline.

- In the past it was man that was the bears' **5.5** _____.
- Currently, their greatest threat is global warming. It is causing the ice mass to shrink, which affects the way polar bears **5.6** _____.
- The longer Arctic summers, during which these animals do not hunt due to the insufficient thickness of the ice pack, are forcing polar bears to go through longer and longer **5.7** _____.
- Females that are pregnant during the Arctic summer must survive on fat reserves in their bodies for longer, which causes their cubs to be born weaker.
- Seals, which are the polar bears' main prey, accumulate a lot of toxic chemicals in their bodies. This, in turn, puts polar bears among **5.8** _____ organisms in the Arctic.

If no action is taken, the polar bear population is predicted to be almost extinct by the end of the century.

Terraforming the Red Planet

Ever since space exploration gradually transformed from a dream into reality, scientists have been taking a lot of interest in the Red Planet. They have noted its gravity, the length of the day, and its distance from the Sun. **6.1** ____ It has also been suggested that the Mars environment might have resembled the conditions currently found on Earth in the early stages of the planet's life.

There are several reasons why the Red Planet could pose an attractive but also a necessary target for further exploration. **6.2** ____ The problems of overpopulation on Earth or the threat of a deadly cosmic disaster could also lead to increased interest in creating new habitats. Even though the Moon seems to be an obvious first choice, Mars would come next on the list of accessible places capable of sustaining life.

Colonisation of the planet on a massive scale will not, however, be possible unless Mars becomes habitable. **6.3** ____ Theoretically, it is feasible through an extended scheme to alter the environment present on the surface of Mars as well as its atmosphere so that large areas of the planet could provide conditions suitable for habitation. Nevertheless, the chances of creating a complete biosphere on the planet are still low and might prove the toughest part of the task.

The terraforming process would obviously be a prolonged and complex one. **6.4** ____ They might involve using large amounts of CO₂ present in certain types of rocks to thicken the atmosphere. This step would be followed by bacteria and other microorganisms transforming the carbon dioxide into oxygen. **6.5** ____ Unfortunately, it would still take decades or more, probably centuries, before people could take a walk in a Martian forest.
